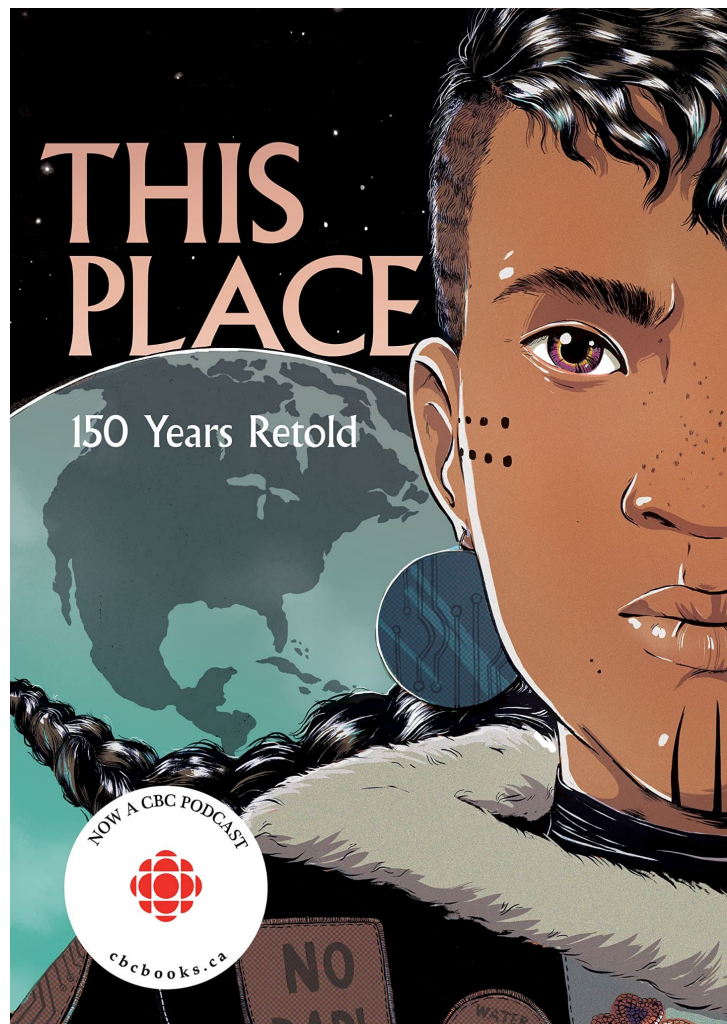

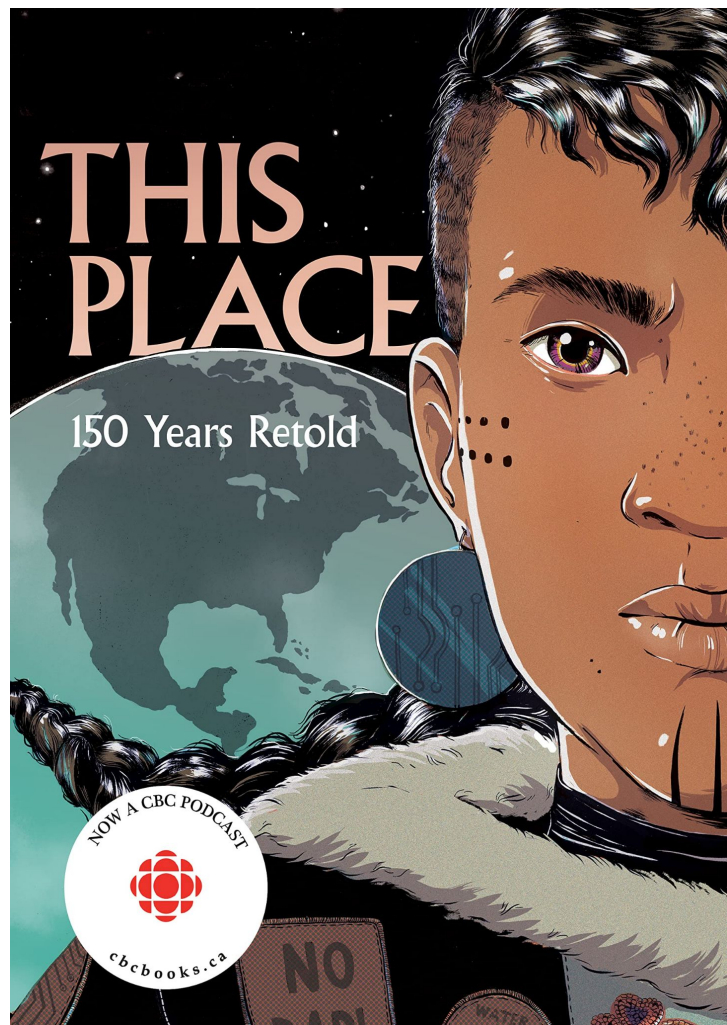
If you could travel anywhere in time, into the future or into the past, what time period would you go to and why?

Terms

Foreword: “a short introduction to a book, typically by a person other than the author”

Anthology: “a published collection of [...] pieces of writing” ex: poems, stories, songs, art

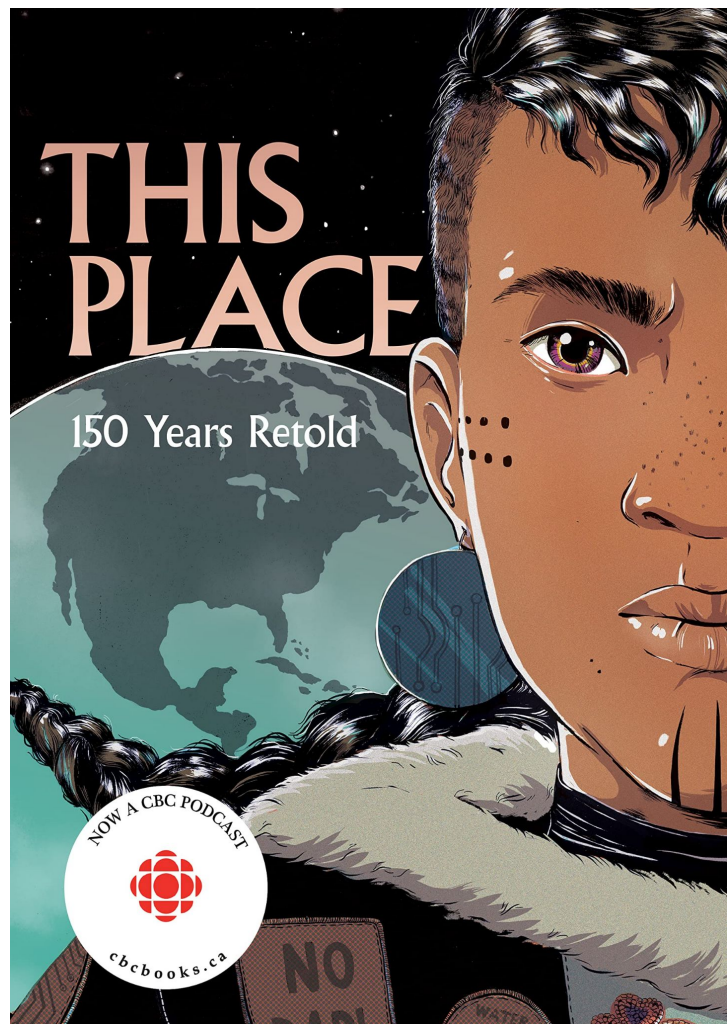
Post-apocalyptic: literature “relating to the time following a nuclear war or other catastrophic event” (OUP)

Contact: the first time an Indigenous group makes a connection with Europeans. Can refer to face-to-face interaction, or to “contact” made through objects, ideas, or disease.
